

Local Disaster Declaration

WHEREAS, the County of King on the 10th of April, 2022, has an imminent threat from wildfires due to dry weather and

WHEREAS, the County Judge of King County has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE County Judge of King County:

That a local state of disaster is hereby declared for King County pursuant to §418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code.


Pursuant to §418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code, the state of disaster shall continue for a period of not more than seven days from the date of this declaration unless continued or renewed by the Commissioners Court of King County.

Pursuant to §418.108(c) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the County Clerk.

Pursuant to §418.108(d) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster activates the County Emergency Management Plan.

That this proclamation is approved by the King County Commissioners Court and shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance. ORDERED this 10th day of April, 2022.




